What's Up Underground? March 19, 2015

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Well, ladies and gentlemen, it's just a great pleasure to welcome back Richard Dolan to The Solari Report. As you know, Richard is one of the leading researchers in the world and writes on the UFO topic. He's my go-to person for anything UFO and alien related, but I also think he's one of the leading thinkers on how we get to Western civilization – how do we get from here to there. What are the obstacles? What are the issues?

I said in the Annual Wrap-Up I think one of the reasons we're pushing for global currency is we're watching a governance infrastructure that wants to set up a financial system that can work on multiple planets. If you want to contemplate that, there is nobody better to listen to than Richard's work on the UFO topic and what some of the key issues are in the debate between centralization and decentralization.

If you haven't dipped into his website <u>www.RichardDolanPress.com</u> and the books he's publishing and the work he's doing, I strongly recommend it. I don't think you can understand reality these days without doing it. I have to say that in a sane world we would be talking to Richard who would probably have a chair in history at Princeton University, but it's a different world. You have to build your own chair these days.

We're going to be talking about what we know about underground facilities. This is a topic that has tremendous economic impact. If you asked me how much of the US GNP was underground I'd probably say it's at least 5-10% or even more. This affects numerous industries – oil and mining, offshore drilling, construction, defense. We're going to be talking about the financial ramifications.

A lot of this world is invisible, and Richard has done a great job including publishing the leading author on underground facilities. He



has done a great job in helping that word get out and about and summarizing it. I'm really glad he could join us today.

Richard, welcome to The Solari Report.

- **RICHARD DOLAN:** Good afternoon, Catherine. It's always a pleasure to be here talking with you. Thank you for having me on.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** I dove in. I got back from the *Secret Space Program* where you and I both spoke, which was just a wonderful experience. I came back realizing that the percentage of the GNP and underground facilities is really bigger than I thought.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** Five to ten percent! That blew my mind when I heard you say that.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** Well, think about it. When we get into financial implications I'll explain why, but I think a lot of the most valuable weaponry is down there. Yes, I think it's pretty significant.

Anyway, I got back and I jumped online. Who's got the best video on underground facilities? I wasn't surprised. It was Richard Dolan. So I'm really glad you can do this. Just dive in, Richard, because I know you know this topic.

RICHARD DOLAN: Well, it's a fascinating topic. I'm not really the main person who's been researching underground bases and facilities for all these years. That distinction goes to my friend and colleague – and your colleague as well – Richard Sauder. Richard, since the 1990's, has written a number of books and done studies on the probable or virtual certainty of a large clandestine network of underground bases and tunnel systems that – in his opinion – are probably global.

A couple of years ago he approached me and asked if I would publish what was then his latest work on the subject, which I agreed to do. It was actually the first book by another author that I had ever published. I've since gone on and published other fascinating authors as part of Richard THE SOLARI REPORT



Dolan Press, but Richard Sauder was the first one.

His book is called *Hidden in Plain Sight*. I published it in April of 2010, I believe. It's been almost five years. This is an excellent book. I think it's his best book on the subject, and as a result of publishing it I went through every page.

I have to say, when I completed working with that book of his – that study – it's one of those short little gems of a book that when you're done with it you feel like it's just transformed the way you look at the world.

What he has argued is that there are many secret underground – and probably undersea – bases and tunnels around the world. He documents what looks like a number of them. "It's one of those short little gems of a book that when you're done with it you feel like it's just transformed the way you look at the world."

These can be very large and surprisingly deep. They contain very sophisticated technology. His argument is that there are many thousands of people involved in building these bases and these systems, operating them, and maintaining these facilities. They're global; they're all around.

He does discuss things like other types of technology, and he basically argues that back in the 1950's and 1960's that the plans were in place, in particular the United States Navy had plans to go very, very deep under the ocean floor for their own permanent undersea bases. This sounds fantastical, but yet he discusses the plans there.

He points out that the technology has existed for decades and generations to do this. A lot of the technology that we have - these very, very high-powered underground boring machines – we've had these for quite some time, and they can do an amazingly effective job. Then there are a number of leaks that have come from the classified world that support this idea also that there are these large facilities.

Basically, underneath our feet there is this whole other world. I study UFOs and we tend to look up at the stars and think, "Oh, I wonder if

there is life out there." But what we really could do with some benefit to ourselves is look below our feet and ask ourselves, "Is there life down there – sophisticated technological life – and is it our own civilization, and is it possible that there are other groups down there as well?"

This is another line of speculation that he has engaged in and a lot of us have engaged in. Are there non-human beings and non-human civilizations under the ground as well? That is a whole different question that we can deal with whenever.

Certainly there's a huge infrastructure down there, and some of the other technologies of transport would include things like high speed tube shuttle train systems. Those probably exist. There's a lot of work on the technology to develop these.

When we talk about maglev train systems, China is really out in the lead on those. The biggest problem with the maglev system is not the weight of the train and not getting the lift; it's actually wind resistance. If you can create an underground tunnel system and create a partial vacuum, you can go incredibly fast under the ground with a maglev system that's in a partial vacuum. In fact, what we now understand through Richard Sauder's work and some other people is that, again, the work and the plans on these have been looked at since the 1930's and 1940's for these types of systems – some of them very, very ingenious.

Way, way back, ultimately when you look at the sum total of the reality of a massive underground system, it's clear that we are being lied to on such a massive scale. I mean, the scope of this is just mind-boggling. I've been looking into the UFO mystery for over 20 years now. I'm used to being lied to. But when you take a few steps back and you get a grand perspective of the magnitude of the lies – not simply with UFOs but with underground bases and the financial fraud and with many of the other things going on in this world like 9/11 – you start realizing, "My God!" This borders magnitude beyond what any normal, sane person should ever have to deal with in terms of being lied to.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.



- **RICHARD DOLAN:** It's a massive reality. I really think that *Hidden in Plain Sight* is probably the best single book on this subject so far.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** I have to tell you, after I left the *Secret Space Program* I was with someone who'd been there. We were driving down the highway in Los Angeles. For the first time I could see a mural in my mind of both the overt and the covert economy both underground, UFOs, space, and the cash flows and how I could literally paint a picture of how the overt and covert cash flows worked underground, on the ground, and in space. I could see it and realize how people could drive down the highway and not see it.

You've got this entire coexisting civilization, and it's completely invisible. It's quite remarkable how it's been done, but it's here and it's operating. If you're going to understand reality, I think you just need to integrate that picture into your mind.

RICHARD DOLAN: That's a really excellent point, Catherine, because I remember asking Richard some years ago how they would hide the construction of these things. He said – and this is the title of his book – "It is hidden in plain sight."

You can hire construction companies from Bechtel onward. There are all of these that would work with a national security complex, and there are all kinds of cover that they're doing with other types of construction that work. Hiding off the side of a highway where everyone is driving. People think, "Oh, they couldn't hide it there." They could and they do.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Yes.

RICHARD DOLAN: They absolutely can hide it there. So, yes, this goes on. Again, in his book – and also you can find it on the web – there is archival research that is available that shows the documents and the plans to do this.

Right after World War II the United States military – and this was an interest of mine before I went off into the UFO research field and I was

still a formal graduate student – I remember spending some time looking at plans that the US Army had to build underground bases after the Second World War. Back then the idea was simply to protect against an atomic war if the Russians got the bomb and they were to drop bombs on us we would need an underground facility to continue in government and so forth. Those plans, we know, have existed.

What we don't know a whole lot of is this full scope of what has been accomplished, but we certainly know that there were a lot of documents and a lot of plans to create underground facilities.

One thing that Richard Sauder did that I think helped him in his research was he had a lot of research and knowledge on drilling and mining technology. It was an important interest in his life aside from travelling and cultivating the sources and getting insider claims, but there is a tremendous amount of good research done in the open literature that indicates these plans.

By the way, as far as how far down these people can go, we're talking anywhere from many hundred feet to many thousands of feet.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: The open literature is miles.

RICHARD DOLAN: Exactly. Last summer I did a tour of Canada. I was in the town of Sudbury, Ontario, which happens to be the site of possibly the deepest officially known scientific underground facility in the world. That is a facility that is a couple of miles below the ground – if I'm not mistaken.

That facility exists in order to protect against x-rays and intense solar radiation, and you've got to go deep under the earth to do it. But that's official and that's a couple of miles below.

I think the deepest mine in the world right now is a little more than two miles if I'm not mistaken. I was looking at some data here, and it's a little over 12,000 feet – two and a half miles. That's the deepest mine.



We're able to go pretty far down, but even if it's one mile, you've got complete security.

Think about who would want an underground base. Well, honestly, everyone would want an underground base. If you're the CIA and running a clandestine prison, would you not want to have a deep, underground base for total security – "If you're the CIA and running a clandestine prison, would you not want to have a deep, underground base for total security."

especially if you were on a little Pacific island in the middle of nowhere? You take someone there and they disappear. They're completely off the face of the earth.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.

RICHARD DOLAN: One of the things, and probably the most fascinating bit of Sauder's research which I think is particularly noteworthy, is the idea of under-ocean bases – bases that are under the ocean floor.

When we first think about that we think, "That's got to be impossible. How could you have a base that is under the floor of the Atlantic or the Pacific Ocean? How could you breathe and so on?"

Well, first of all, we should keep in mind that we have already built substantial tunnels that go under large bodies of water. If you're in the New York City area and you go through the Lincoln Tunnel or the Holland Tunnel, boom! You've got that.

If you go from England to France you take this Channel Tunnel that is over 20 miles under the ocean floor. Japan also has an equally long tunnel that's over 20 miles in length that people go under the ocean floor. We've got the technology. This is all out in the open and the ability to do it.

One of the things that Sauder uncovered were explicit US Navy illustrations from the 1960's by a Navy artist and illustrator named Walter Kirchner – who is still alive, by the way. Sauder had a number of



interviews with Kirchner, who ended up giving him the illustrations he did for the Navy. They contracted with him in 1968 to draw illustrations of a proposed underwater facility that they were possibly planning to build.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: I love the one of the guys playing ping-pong!

RICHARD DOLAN: Exactly! I mean, this is under the ocean floor, and there's one where they're playing ping-pong and having a nice, relaxing time. All that you need, ultimately, is oxygen and a source of energy, and you basically can do this.

Since the 1950's we've had the ability to abstract oxygen out of the water – hydrolysis. This is what nuclear submarines use to stay under the water for months at a time. They're not using oxygen tanks clearly. They're taking the oxygen out of the ocean floor.

Then if you have a small source of energy or geothermal energy – or even a small, nuclear reactor technology – which has existed, obviously, since the 1950's, you really can do it as long. As you've got a geological location you can carve out your underground base under the ocean floor and you're in total secrecy.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: The source of energy has always been of great interest to me because there's no way those guys could be running that much stuff on fossil fuels that far underneath the earth. So the question is: What are they using? And to the extent they're connected with UFOs, certainly they have something other than fossil fuels.

To me, that's one of the great mysteries.

RICHARD DOLAN: Nuclear power – even standard fission – can easily get the job done.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Yes, that's true.

RICHARD DOLAN: A fission reactor is a major undertaking, but what about a

small fission reactor – something you couldn't take care of an entire region of a state, but maybe just one particular base. Perhaps it could be done on a manageable scale.

- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** You know, it's interesting they didn't want thorium. Rickover killed thorium in the 1970's, but thorium would be a much safer way to go and I would think it would work underground.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** I don't know about that, but I wouldn't doubt it. But we have nuclear submarines. We have aircraft carriers that run on nuclear fuel. Those are essentially massive cities on the water. They don't need to be refueled for decades at a time, and we've had that capability for many decades.

I would think that if nothing else, you could use something along those lines to power these underground facilities if you wanted them totally off the grid.

Kirchner had a number of these illustrations. He was attached to the China Lake facility during the 1960's, and it was at that time that the Navy was developing detailed plans to create large technological, complex, deeply buried man bases beneath the sea floor in mid-ocean. His job in 1968 was to illustrate the Navy's plan.

He did one and it was a depiction – a good one – off Santa Catalina Island, right off the coast of Southern California. It was a nice illustration that basically gives kind of a cut-out of below the water how this would be constructed in the ground. He's got illustrations of divers and openings into the ground. Occasionally there are glass bubbles in the water. It almost has a little bit of a Jetsons look to it.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: It really does.

RICHARD DOLAN: It's kind of optimistic-futuristic technology there, but what's key about it is when he does the plans for the geology under the ocean floor, cutting away certain parts of under-ocean mountains to create spaces and this type of thing. This is a really big part of his



illustrations, so it's obvious this was what the Navy was planning to do.

What we don't have is confirmation from the Navy as to when these went into place. This was decades ago. I remember asking Richard Sauder, "Did Kirchner know?" Sauder asked Kirchner, "Do you know if they built these bases?"

Kirchner said, "Look, my job was just to draw the pictures. I had nothing to do with building these things." So Kirchner doesn't really claim to have any knowledge either.

- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** If you look at how much money is disappearing, Richard, during this period, I can't come up with too many other ways. If you look at how much money is disappearing, it has to be justified by something. It just says to me, "I bet they've poured a lot of money underground." I just can't fathom it unless we're paying a dividend off-planet.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** In terms of the amount of money needed, I want to deal with this. In fact, yes, these are expensive. But even for the time they were not outrageously expensive.

There is a study from 1968 called 'The Feasibility of Manned In-Bottom Bases' from the Stanford Research Institute in California. It's a 1968 paper, and they state here the construction of 30 manned in-bottom bases within the ocean floor is technically and economically feasible. Their estimate was that it might take 15 years to get this whole thing underway, but they state the major technology for a land-linked station in-bottom is established now; only adaptations are needed.

Their estimate of the cost to build 30 undersea bases was \$2.7 billion in 1968. That's a lot of money even in 1968, but it's not a sum that would be impossible.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: No. Here's what does get expensive, though, is maintenance. If you look at how much it costs to build them, and then you look at how much it costs to maintain them every year, you're



locking in a significant overhead. The overhead grows and grows and grows. That's where I think it all – from a financial standpoint – gets very interesting.

RICHARD DOLAN: I think that's a good point. No question.

I had a conversation some years ago with a well-placed scientist. I think you'll want to hear this. This man confirmed to me on multiple occasions the existence of deeply clandestine programs to study and attempt to replicate alien technology. conversations with him. He's rather famous, and one day I'll put his name out there.

We were talking about the creation of an expensive infrastructure and basically what the secrecy entailed. He put out to me his belief – or maybe knowledge – that the cost of security and maintaining all the secrecy on this program was seven to eight times that of the actual scientific R&D.

- C. AUSTIN FITTS: Absolutely.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** By security he had to be talking underground infrastructures – I'm assuming – as well as guys with guns as well as management of the media and all of the things involved in maintaining security over the program, but vastly more expensive than the actual science involved.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** I really believe that one of the primary goals of the legal infrastructure they put in place after 9/11 was to significantly reduce the cost of capital and the difficulty of financing and just the basic costs of keeping it secret all of this world. It had reached an unbearable level, and you literally had to change the laws related to government transparency and financing and all sorts of other stuff to make it possible to keep it secret at a feasible cost.



RICHARD DOLAN: I want to make sure I'm understanding you. This sounds like a really important point.

In other words, it's cheaper now for those individuals to maintain the secret?

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Put it this way: First of all, let's say that pre-9/11 for every \$1,000 you spent on black budget operations, including underground, let's say 9/11 cut your cost of capital in half. Now instead of spending \$1,000 you could spend \$800. Really it was because of: First, you could do a lot more on budget than this crazy, dysfunctional fraud off budget. Second, you had stolen enough money so you had a permanent endowment that you didn't have to explain to anybody. But also, you had the laws in place.

I used to call the Patriot Act the 'control and concentration of cash flow act of 2001', but you have the controls in place so a lot of what you are spending to keep things secret you didn't have to spend. You can make it cheaper.

So you lower your expenses, you lower your cost of capital, and you make the whole thing much more manageable because you couldn't increase the size of it. It kept growing and growing and growing. You couldn't grow it anymore without just unbelievable consequences. You're just going to have to kill way too many people to keep it silent.

RICHARD DOLAN: I do understand. I hadn't really thought about it your way in terms of finance, but that makes perfect sense. It makes absolutely perfect sense. This is why your work is so important.

I had seen 9/11 as almost like a debutant coming out party. Really. We had the development of this national security empire that's been happening for decades, but a lot of it was still technically illegal – all the government spying. Instead of development of this national security state out of the corpse of the republic – like in the movie Alien – it was all sort of unofficial still. We still – officially speaking – had this system of rule of law. What 9/11 did was it was like essentially a coming out. It was



like, "Now we have a new system of government." It really did simplify a lot of the legalities of the illegal; it made legal the illegalities.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Here's the problem you've got: When you're running huge numbers of illegal operations, and let's say you're depending on leadership of 1,000 people. When they start to fight they start to throw criminal liabilities at each other. Then the thing explodes.

A perfect example was when Hank Paulson, who didn't know he couldn't let AIG go down, threatened to let AIG go down. A thousand leaders suddenly realized they were going to have their files that proved criminal liability against them everywhere. They just said, "No way!"

- **RICHARD DOLAN:** That's why AIG was too big to fail.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** It was too big to fail because you had what was the equivalent of a government and shadow government bureaucracy that was manning the risk liabilities on 50 years of black budget operations and financing. To this day I believe it was AIG that traded the government and currency markets to basically self-finance 9/11.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** It had to be preserved not to preserve the economy, but to preserve those individuals from going to prison.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** No. It was bigger than that because if you let AIG go down and let those files go to the highest bidder, you are talking about flipping the entire investment model on the whole planet earth.

In other words, the central banking warfare model could not tolerate that disclosure, so you would have needed to have a new economic model in place – literally.

- **RICHARD DOLAN:** To maintain that secret. That's what you're saying. It's not simply for economic salvation; it is to maintain the secrecy of this covet operation.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** Right. So let me just take you on a tangent for a second.

The *New York Times* just published an article by Gretchen Morgenson who's been following the mortgage debacle. A shareholder of Freddie and Fannie filed a lawsuit demanding documentation on the government's takeover of Freddie and Fannie.

Here we are in 2015. The government is taking the position in court that disclosure of that documentation would crash the financial system, and Morgenson is saying, "That's absurd! This is 2015! We're talking about something that happened in 2008. The markets have moved on. This can't possibly hurt the markets."

I agree with the government. If people understood that Fannie, Freddie, the Department of Justice, and the Department of Treasury were all going along for years doing ten mortgages on one house there would be a problem.

- **RICHARD DOLAN:** Sure there would. There are many of these dark secrets that go back decades. That's why they have to lie about the Kennedy assassination. The people who killed Kennedy are still fundamentally in power today.
- C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right. Well, of course, to the victor go the spoils, right?
- RICHARD DOLAN: Yes.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** So this comes down to the line between the real world and Disneyworld. Anything that tears that fabric down is a really sensitive point.

Before you go on, I just have to bring up one thing. You have a wonderful section in your presentation that you have online about the Denver airport. When I was on Wall Street there used to be scandal after scandal in the firms that were financing the Denver airport. It got to the point where I never paid any attention to it. It was rare because I was known for infrastructure financing, but I had nothing to do with that one.



The stories just became so bizarre as to the overruns that you said, "I don't know what's going on there, but whatever is going on there is really dangerous and bizarre."

It's just funny because even back then we knew something was terribly, terribly wrong. It's those Orwellian situations.

- **RICHARD DOLAN:** The Denver airport is one of those things that everyone who has looked into this a little bit is very suspicious of and fascinated by it. We've both been to the Denver airport, and you walk around and there are some very bizarre murals incidentally in there.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** The murals are just mind-boggling.

RICHARD DOLAN: Yes.

- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** You can't believe that a municipal official approved that!
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** It's horrific, apocalyptic scenes of futuristic death and armies in black uniforms just controlling and mowing down innocent people and causing death. I mean, who the hell comes up with these ideas? It's insane!

Then, of course, there is the demonic horse in front of the airport with the glowing red eyes. It's like – what is this place? Where am I going, to the gates of hell?

In terms of Sauder's work on it, I remember asking him about it. He feels that this is important, but remember he spent more time talking about some of the other nearby places. There is a Denver Federal Center which is a location of an underground FEMA underground command center which he feels is more important than the Denver airport. He didn't really write a lot about the Denver airport in *Hidden in Plain Sight*, but I remember I personally spoke to a number of people in the



Denver area who seemed to have real knowledge of this.

Famously construction on that airport was delayed for like a year. They were talking about conveyer belt issues and people were like, "Really? Conveyer belt issues? This caused a delay for an entire year?"

It seemed like a very lame excuse, and I'm not aware of these being confirmed, but there are constant rumors of a massive second seed of government base underneath that airport.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.

RICHARD DOLAN: I'd be surprised if there weren't something major there, but that whole region – Colorado with the Cheyenne Mountain, of course, and the major underground command center for NORAD and to the southwest you've got massive underground bases over at the Kirtland and the Manzano facilities in New Mexico.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.

RICHARD DOLAN: That's since the 1940's. Richard spoke to a miner who excavated the Manzano base. A lot of these miners were blindfolded when they were transported to and from the work site, so no one knew the layout as a result of that.

Then there is the whole Los Alamos and White Sands complex out there. These are massive underground sprawling facilities going as much as a mile deep. There is a major underground component over at White Sands.

There is one account he got from an ex-Navy guy over at White Sands who knew a water well contractor was hired to do work there. The guy was hired to drill 10-12" holes down to like 800-1,000 feet. He thought, "Alright, no big deal."

While he was drilling, his big bit broke through many times and cold air would rush up through the hole. His boss just said, "Don't worry about



it."

There are air shafts down there. He probably was reaching a major facility down there that needed air shafts, and it wasn't his business to know. Then, of course, you've got the massive facilities over in Nevada – Area 51, Tonopah, Nevada Test Site, S-4 and Nellis Air Force Base. That whole area, which I think is larger than the nation of Switzerland if my memory serves me correctly, is replete with massive underground facilities.

There is China Lake in California. Again, it's the same thing. These are bases that probably go a mile deep or even more.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Many years ago I used to have a subscriber who knew the Bush family, and he insisted that Zapata was not an offshore drilling company for oil; it was drilling for missile silos as a proprietary for the CIA. That wouldn't surprise me because I think between the mining industry and the offshore drilling I think there is a lot of crossover.

I really started to watch the earnings of these different companies to try to compute how much of this is covert versus overt. I noticed in the 1990's a lot of the big offshore drilling companies suddenly pulled up stakes and moved to Switzerland or Bermuda or completely reconfigured their whole company. Halliburton moved to spin off KBR and move to Dubai.

You had this flood of companies moving offshore and you wondered how much of it was to protect their national security operations.

RICHARD DOLAN: Yes, and so much of this has gone out of the country. It's international. We don't have an era of nations anymore. You as much as anyone else have talked about this. We've only recently experienced the death of nations as well as the death of the rule of law, but these organizations go where they want.

When I was a kid, I was taught as a youngster – and you probably were, too – a very nationalistic, American-centered history. That world is gone.

That's long gone. That doesn't exist anymore.

These guys can exist and do their operations anywhere in the world, and that goes for these underground bases and what I have often called the 'Breakaway Civilization' with weaponry that is off the charts and technology that is off the charts.

Incidentally, I am reminded of a conversation Sauder had with a Navy engineer who had worked at China Lake. He was talking about a huge underground facility there, and Sauder asked, "What's down there?"

The guy just said, "Weapons."

Sauder asked, "What kind of weapons?"

All he would say is, "Weapons more powerful than nuclear weapons," whatever that means.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: You found the earthquake machine.

RICHARD DOLAN: Yes, right, or something like that.

One question is: Where is the money coming from to fund all of this? Obviously we're talking about beyond simply formal classified tax dollars in the form of the official black budget. According to *Wired Magazine*, I think that's like a little over \$50 billion. Really? *Wired Magazine*! Are you serious?

The official black budget number from 1990 as reported by Tim Weiner back then was over \$30 billion, and that was with a defense budget of about \$300 billion at the time, roughly speaking. We're almost three times that amount now, and we're supposed to believe that the black budget is only \$50 billion? I seriously doubt that.

The securities fraud money, narcotics money, and the black hole at the center of our global financial system and all of it.



C. AUSTIN FITTS: We required in the first Bush administration audit a financial statement, and a process started in 1995 whereby they said, "We can't comply." In fact, 9/11 was given as the excuse why they

couldn't because you blew up one of the financial offices at the Pentagon.

Anyway, if you look at the numbers, my theory on all of this, if you look at where the underground bases are said to be – at least in North America – it's very contiguous to the patterns of big mortgage and other placebased fraud like drug dealing levered by mortgage fraud. geographical alignment between the sources and the needs.

I think if you look at what happened in the 1990's, you had a very strategic effort to say, "Look, we can't keep going this way. We need to create an endowment of funds that can literally produce an ongoing funding of this operation on a private basis."

Think of this as privatizing the federal finances – or at least a portion of it.

RICHARD DOLAN: Yes. Exactly.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: They didn't clean up all the financial fraud. All the money during the balance wasn't used to pay off all the fraud from what I can tell. That money went somewhere.

If you look at the squabbles in G7 between the government leaders saying they're going to go after the offshore monies, I think that's more than just the offshore money. If you look at what has been said to be in offshore havens, I think then they talk about offshore they're talking about a much bigger pile of money.

I think the breakaways now have private funding lined up and own a significant portion of the world's corporate infrastructure.



RICHARD DOLAN: It has to be. Here's a thought that I've been kicking around for the past year or so in terms of the Breakaway Civilization. Isn't it accurate to say that what we're seeing right now is a 'Breakaway Financial Civilization' in terms of the construction of basically transnational legal entities? One example is the Transpacific Partnership Agreement which other people are talking about, all of which are created by a small number of leading corporate entities and are allowing them to break away from traditional national control.

My guess is that we're seeing the construction and the creation of basically a new royalty – the new lords and the new serfs (which is us) – who will no longer need to have any kind of connection to traditional national sovereignty. I think this is probably as a way to consolidate control by the actual Breakaway Civilization.

You're right. They are involved in the financial control, and they're completely breaking away from the world. Once their control is complete, I think there is an end game in mind here the more that I think about this. I think that one of the things that is happening is like in the movie Highlander where they used to say, "There can only be one."

Do you remember that movie with the guys with the swords who were immortal?

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Yes.

RICHARD DOLAN: They would have their head cut off, and then they would lose their power and it would go to the guy who had killed them. I think that we're actually in that. In other words, for the first time in human history, we have the ability for a very small number of people to own basically everything – the water, the genetically modified foods, the minerals. This hasn't really been the case in centuries past to own everything on the planet.

I think what we're seeing is the consolidation of power blocks, primarily there is a power block that controls the US and the EU and NATO and THE SOLARI REPORT

all of that. Then you have another power block that is still substantial, and that is Russia and now it looks like China. This is my take on it. They have a very close relationship in many ways, and that's kind of related to the BRICS group, but I think it's really Russia and China who are running that.

- C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** And I think that the Wall Street and White House nexus is trying to destroy Russia right now and maybe break China however they can, but they want to take Russia out of the game. Somehow I'm trying to see how this relates to the Breakaway Civilization.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** It relates to who is in control of the global currency. That's what it relates to.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** Exactly.
- C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** They've got the petrodollar I assume.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** Yes. Part of the challenge is: How do you replace the Bretton Woods system, and what do you replace it with? Also, how do you create the financial infrastructure to go to a multi-planet society? I agree with you. I think that there can only be one, and the question is: How does that all get sorted out?

I agree. I think they want to break Russia because they want to make sure Germany and Europe is tied into them and not to the BRICS and the Eurasian group.

I want to go back in history for a second before we come out of the past. I want to bring up some of the related topics that I thought about when I was watching your incredible presentation.

One is: I went back about six months ago and I listened to Annie



Jacobsen's book on audio, *Operation Paperclip*. I would say that it's a lot of detail on Operation Paperclip that I hadn't heard. I don't necessarily agree with her frame work or assessment, but there was a lot of detailed information.

I heard a lot about the Nazi Germany underground bases in manufacturing and the labor policies they used, how they ran it with slave labor.

RICHARD DOLAN: Right.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: It sounded remarkably like Paperclip. It came out of the Nazis we brought over because we got all their technology. We made a real effort to suck up their underground technology. I thought, "Okay, now I see where this guy is going."

But the other reason – because Jacobsen went into a lot of detail about their labor policies – at the time I was interviewing Zack Taylor on the extraordinary flood of immigration. He is the head of the National Association of Former Border Patrol Agents. He and the border patrol guys are saying that the immigration is much greater than is being described in the press or by the government.

Of course, the big question is: Where are all these people going? One of the questions I have is: How many of them are disappearing down into the underground bases? The underground bases need cleaning ladies, too.

RICHARD DOLAN: Wow! Yes. I think that is actually reasonable. By the way, her book got penned for her whole Roswell piece – which I think was completely wrong – but there was a lot of good information in there as you were pointing out with the Paperclip connection. That certainly is important, and the fact that basically she's just another argument that shows that after World War II the United States swallowed the Nazi pill. We just took it and created a lot of our post World War II infrastructure based off the Nazi model.



Where they pioneered the construction of sophisticated underground facilities during the Second World War, they really had some of the best people in the world, and we brought them over. Dornberger, who is the supervisor to Wernher von Braun, was himself a genius and was one of the key people involved in helping to formulate underground bases here

in the United States after the war. What prompted Dornberger?

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right. One of the reasons I was so interested is, of course, when I see the UFOs, the question is: Who is manufacturing that? The Germans were very good at manufacturing underground and keeping the manufacturing secret as a result of that. "The Germans were very good at manufacturing underground and keeping the manufacturing secret as a result of that."

I just think that if you go back and you look at

what the Germans were doing, and the thing that is chilling, of course, is that that whole group believed in slave labor. That is how they made a lot of this go.

- **RICHARD DOLAN:** The United States had a nice, long history of endorsing slave labor. We called it slavery. It actually made a lot of economic sense for those white plantation owners back in those days. They thought that was the best way to do it.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** If you look at the 1990's, we had an unprecedented amount and I don't know if you've ever read my online book and explosion in prison population. That's another question I have. Is any of that population disappearing down into these bases? It's a scary thing to contemplate, but I think it's a question that needs to be asked.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** Disappearing and being medically experimented on there are all kinds of possibilities here in our increasingly privatized system.

There is some slaver for you, by the way. It's just as color-coded as we had 150 years ago. Basically we're paying these people \$1 a day to make



clothing for Target or whatever they're doing in the prison system so that it can say, "Made in the USA." That's how we compete with Chinese slave labor with our American slaves.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right, although if you look at the economics of government money, it doesn't compete. I mean, the government is spending \$154,000 per person so that Target can pay \$1 an hour. It's not cheaper.

RICHARD DOLAN: Right. Very good point.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Yes. The government money is fantastic, but whether it's with prison population or the immigration population, there is some kind of dovetail that I don't understand but I think is worth thinking about.

A second thing I wanted to ask you about is: If you look at the areas where the underground bases are, there are also areas that are having more and more problems with drought. I almost wonder if there is a connection between the water used by the underground bases and the droughts or the dropping water tables.

- **RICHARD DOLAN:** That is fascinating. Now, there are a number of underground base facilities in the Eastern US.
- C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** There are a lot in Virginia and in Washington.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** All of Washington is an underground base and doesn't know it.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** Exactly. We've all heard about the NSA data collection center in Utah that is billions of dollars and has every single email that has ever been created in the history of the internet. They use massive amounts of water huge amounts of water all from the state of Utah.

In fact, there is a citizen movement there to cut off that water. I'm sure they'll get nowhere because we live in basically a global totalitarian system now, but I've got to think that's a tremendous amount of water that is being used there. These other underground facilities – all unofficial, but they exist – that's a great question. They have to be using an enormous amount of water.

- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** Yes, that's what I would think. That dovetails also with what they're doing, especially if they're using nuclear.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** For sure. Exactly. Or for massive computers, the NSA center in Utah, which officially does exist, uses that to cool their computers. It's an enormous amount of water that they go through every day.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** Right. Okay. Place-based amnesia. Let me explain what I mean by this. One of my struggles is this. I've always been interested in building the community economy, thinking of the community as a molecule of the body. If the local economy isn't healthy, then individuals can't be healthy, and then the state economy can't be healthy, and then the national economy.

I've always liked to think about building wealth bottom-up, sort of one person or one household or one community at a time. I always had a problem with Wall Street and Washington because everybody thought it had to be done by tomorrow, and it needed to be at least \$1 billion.

I thought, "Wait a minute. We've got to unpack this." Any time I tried to look at the economy by place, you would run into this political force field. What I discovered working in Washington and then serving as a financial advisor for a government agency is that the people who run the world look at everything by place. What they do is they do everything they can to get everyone else not to look at place because that busts their control.

If you have the sources and uses of government spending by your congressional district, then you can really hold your congressman



accountable. So control requires people being sort of dumbed down about places. Until Google Maps came out, it was almost as though people were getting dumber and dumber.

Literally, Richard, I can drive into a town on Route 64, stop at a diner, and ask the waitress where Route 64 is and she won't know. It's scary.

RICHARD DOLAN: Yes.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: There is kind of a dumbing down going on, and if you look at what is happening with the internet technology, at some point it's going to reverse it.

When I drive around and look for the signs of underground facilities, I can see them and I can see some of the possibilities of how they might be financed because these guys always like to get as much out of a place as they put back in. There is always an interaction with the local share, but there is something about our mentality as a people that we have become – whether it's mind control or programming or what it is – people who can't see.

If you ask somebody where the Navy and Army bases are in their state, they won't know.

RICHARD DOLAN: Right.

- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** I'm just curious if you're running into the place-based amnesia as you do this.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** Well, I see what you're seeing around me if that's what you're asking. I certainly think that it's kind of like this unstated revolution has happened. It's an unofficial revolution. All of the old forms exist. There is still television, there is still TV news, but I would agree that it's just gotten more and more mindless and more and more of a distraction to the point where it's just a virtual mind control system.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.



RICHARD DOLAN: We still officially have news articles and we still have newspapers, but behind those newspapers has been a consolidation of corporate ownership so that you have very few companies that own everything. All of that is hidden behind these veils.

RICHARD DOLAN: We teach kids to read and write. All these institutions are formally there, but behind that has been fundamental changes. That has absolutely resulted in a massive dumbing down of our population.

What was the news article I was just seeing recently? Well, all of the video cameras and things like that. We've become inured to the fact that we're surveilled 24/7. If those video cameras that are on every single street corner of every major city in this country had been put up 30 years ago, people would have gone insane about that. They never would have allowed it. Never.

- C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** And we've gotten beaten over the head with a national security stupid stick for all of these decades, and this is where we're at.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** I love that! The national security stupid stick!
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** I make this up as I go. So we go around ducking our head and just accepting it. That's why I believe we live in an era, incidentally, of false flags. I'm convinced of this. It's the doorway to a new era. We're in an era of false flags. The reason, I think – and I don't want to get too off topic here – it has to be done from the point of view of those people



who are transforming the world.

They need to corral the population into accepting increasingly draconian measures to control them because this is necessary from their point of view in order to create the kind of global system that they need to create. They need to create a global totalitarian system from their point of view.

In fact, this can tie into a Breakaway Civilization. I've been thinking about this lately.

- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** Right. The Breakaway Civilization is steadily taking over more and more and more of the flow.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** Yes, they are. There are two races going on right now as I see it. One race is between Breakaway Civilization/Control Group at the top and the people. It's like a foot race. In the race, will we be able to break their power by communicating and organizing and exposing the criminality before they consolidate their hold over global totalitarian system, in which it might be impossible for us to break? That's one race.

The other race is the Breakaway Civilization against these other beings that are here. I want to explain this. There is very overwhelming evidence from my research showing that there is the presence of an 'other' that is here on Planet Earth. All these flying saucers and UFOs that people are seeing are not all human manufactured.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.

RICHARD DOLAN: Some think we are. You and I are both very good friends of Joseph Farrell. He's made some very good arguments along these lines. I think that's right. We've got our own homemade flying saucers. I do not believe for an instant that all of them or even the core of them are made by us.

If there is a Breakaway Civilization that exists, I guarantee you that they are looking at those other beings from a military point of view and saying, "We are way behind these guys, and we've got to catch up THE SOLARI REPORT



desperately or we're potentially screwed."

- C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** So how do they do that? We're talking about a massive covert R&D and manufacturing program. That cannot be done under the public eye with public scrutiny from their point of view because that's unacceptable. That would cause too much panic and it would give the game away.

So they do it covertly. The only way to do it covertly is by subverting every constitutional law that you can imagine. They have to go around all that. Also, I believe that their take on it is that the only way that we're going to catch up is by reorganizing the society. This democracy ruled by the people is old fashioned. That can't work. We have to create a truly global totalitarian system, and I think that's exactly what they're moving for.

- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** I think it can work, but I think you have to clue everybody in on what's really going on.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** I agree with you. I'm trying to look at it from their point of view, and I think this is what they've concluded.

All of this ties in. I think there's going to be an ultimate end game incidentally where they probably – what we call a Breakaway Civilization – what they are moving towards is a true version of Hitler's master race. Think about the world that they're going to be able to create within 50 years, not simply strong artificial intelligence, not simply quantum computing which may already exist for all we know, not simply complete mastery of the human genome, not simply 3D printing which will probably be organic 3D printing, not simply a panoply of massive, sophisticated implants within the human being to give them superpowers, which in fact part of the military is already using now.

I've talked with a number of these military people. The things that they can do with implants is amazing.



It's not simply because of their master of the human genome to be able to cut off the aging process – or at least substantially reduce it – to give super-intelligence and super-strength. Think about this. They are right on the cusp of creating virtual immortality, super-strength, and superintelligence for human beings. I'm pretty sure they're not going to want to give it to all of us.

So it will be for a very small group of people who can afford this, and it will be them, and they will literally create themselves as a kind of master superhuman race. On top of that, with control over a system, once the masses are under control of a virtual 24/7 complete mind control propaganda-induced reality, which we're not quite there yet but we're getting in there, once they're sufficiently confident that they've got this completely under their control, I wouldn't be surprised then if they decide, "Yes, we'll let the people know a little about this, that, and the other because there's really nothing that they'll be able to do about it."

They won't need to do false flags as much because it will be a complete control system. Right now they have to do false flags. They have to feign terrorist attacks. Not simply 9/11 or Anthrax. That's old school. The constant scare mongering that goes on in conjunction with mainstream media to frighten people to give up more and more and more of their rights and to give up for more and more centralized control.

I believe that, as I said, we're in an era of almost continual false flags until we get to a point of a true totalitarianism system. Then they'll probably switch tactics and move onto something else.

- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** I don't know if you've noticed, but several of the most popular and widest circulation magazines have had cover stories about how we can all live to 123.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** Yes. *Time* or *Newsweek* just had one. You can live to 140-something. Who knows?

That capability, they really understand it more and more. All of it has to do with the telomeres in your DNA. They can prevent them now from THE SOLARI REPORT



degrading apparently. It's only a matter of time before they're going to figure this out. I don't think anyone doubts this at this point.

Then the real question philosophically is: What do we do then? Even if you allowed people to live, what if we could live 120 or 130 or 140 years? Would we do that at a certain cost? Would we be therefore indebted to the new corporate fascist system and have to work at some

menial slave job until we're 100 years old or 120 years old? I mean, really, what would we do? This is a whole other series of questions, but what would we do with such a long lifespan?

C. AUSTIN FITTS: The other problem is if you look to technology to make you longer lived or more powerful as opposed to accessing the powers that humans have that have been dumbed out, it's kind of going in the wrong way to me. the capability of doing individually and collectively with natural methods is extraordinary. There has been an extraordinary effort to keep us from doing that. I kind of think it's taking us in the wrong direction.

Can I pull you back to the money for a second? There are a couple of financial points I want to bring up that are a little bit more mundane. Are you aware of the national security waiver that allows the President or the National Security Advisor to waive a company's obligations to comply with the SCC and other national rules about securities and financial disclosure?

RICHARD DOLAN: No, but that sounds very ominous and really bad.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: That happened during the Bush administration. They passed all these laws as a response to different various problems. As they did, these companies that are doing – I think – a lot of the underground stuff or all the different things you've been talking about couldn't



reconcile complying with financial disclosure laws and reporting all these earnings and engaging in these activities.

RICHARD DOLAN: They don't have to report it.

- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** Right. It's funny. I constantly have heated debates back and forth with the financial community because they say, "Corporate earnings can't possibly continue the way they are," but they're not looking at the full scope of corporate earnings. In a funny kind of way, you have a better handle on the fundamentals of corporate earnings than most financial advisors, I think.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** That's a frightening thought to me because if that's true we're in real trouble. I would say this along the same lines. This is directly analytics. When we talk about taxing, like right now the Obama administration wants to tax the top one percent of income earners. Let me just say this: If someone is making \$10 million and they want to have a nicer pool than I have and they want to have a nicer house than I have and they want to have a better car, fine. Let them. There is nothing wrong in my opinion with a capitalist system that financially rewards people in aspects of our economy that are valued. I'm perfectly cool with that.

It's someone who is making \$10 billion a year or is worth \$100 billion or more. These are the people who control governments. These are the people who can gain the system.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.

RICHARD DOLAN: Those people with \$5 million or \$10 million – they're nothing, and yet these are the individuals who seem to be the real target of the current administration's actions. "You're making \$5 million. We can more than half of your money away."

You know what? I would say, "Screw that!" In other words, they're not looking at the actual culprit.

Then think about environmental damage. We hear lots about climate change and the problems of driving your car, so you're contributing to global warming or what have you. I hear no one talking about the more than 2,000 high altitude nuclear blasts that have taken place on this planet since the end of World War II to the end of the century and what environmental damage that has done. No one talks about that. I hear nothing about the ruinous effects of geoengineering, which is all but out in the open now. Nothing has been acknowledged, and there are particulates in those trails that are nasty and are doing serious environmental damage. I hear nothing about that.

In other words, what we see across the board – financially, environmentally or any other way – is we're looking at the wrong culprits and we're really just trying to blame the little guy for problems that are being done by those very few individuals at the very tippy-top of the power structure.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right.

RICHARD DOLAN: No one looks at them.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: I wouldn't say, "No one". You're here. I'm here. We're looking at them. But the message I want to keep bringing back to everybody is 'they' are very expensive. These operations – whether it's the geoengineering or the underground bases or the spaceships or the black budget – that is the financial drain that has been harvesting the whole planet and harvesting our budget. To me, the reason you've got to look at it is because you cannot back the drug dealers out of your neighborhood because they're financing Tony Soprano who is financing James Bond who is financing Area 51.

On a cash flow basis, this is the problem that you are having financially. You are paying for an extraordinary infrastructure that is very expensive and increasingly wealthy. The wealthier it gets, the more it harvests you financially. This is it.

RICHARD DOLAN: True. You and other analysts have said this. There is a big



black hole at the center of the global financial system. Trillions of dollars have just apparently disappeared. Did they just go away?

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Here's the funny thing. If you said, "Okay, you know something? We're going to bring transparency, but we're going to bring transparency in a way that creates more wealth for our civilization to make sure that we have planetary sovereignty" – because I think that is part of what these guys are trying to buy. They are trying to buy planetary sovereignty and they are trying to be a two-planet system.

If you want depopulation, the guys who die are the ones who can't take the shock. I'm with Winston Churchill. I vote for transparency because I don't think whatever they're trying to accomplish you can do on a nontransparent basis. I mean, you have to have secrecy. But whatever you're doing, this is so unnatural, so unhealthy, and so perverted.

The population that is left would rather – I don't know if death is the worst thing that can happen.

RICHARD DOLAN: Yes. They're creating a world of comprehensive web-like structure of lies that exist no matter where you look. I mean, that's not a way for a dignified human civilization to exist.

If we're lucky, they are trying to preserve our planetary sovereignty – as you put it. That's a possibility I've wondered about. The other possibility is that they're acting like any other third world dictator who is into the pay of American or corporate power, selling out the population and getting a piece of the action.

- C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right. That's a possibility, too.
- **RICHARD DOLAN:** Looking at human behavior over the years, I think that's at least as possible as the more noble goal of preserving our sovereignty. I don't really know.
- **C. AUSTIN FITTS:** Whichever it is, we're on our own.



RICHARD DOLAN: I remember a journey that I had a little over 20 years ago when I started researching UFOs. My mind was in a much more constricted area. I was just looking at that one phenomena, and I

thought, "If I wrote a book that was good enough to crack that wall of secrecy, wouldn't that be a great thing to do?" That's what I set out to do. Of course, it hasn't really happened. We haven't really opened up the wall of secrecy, but now when I look at the monumental web of secrecy and lies that envelop our daily lives, it's just an astonishing thing to me.

RICHARD DOLAN: My mind was not in this place 20 years ago. Going through this journey, it's

clear to me that the secrecy and the deception is so engrained. It's like Monsanto Roundup that's embedded in the very GMO plants that we're eating. That's the lies themselves embedded in our very being. It's the exact same type of thing. They create these genetically modified plants that are able to absorb the toxic Roundup and not die, just kill off the insects. When you're eating a genetically modified plant, you're eating Roundup.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: Right, but I have two messages out of all of this, Richard. That is, first of all, economically if you look at how the finances work, there is no reason for this planet not to have abundant wealth. Whatever our problems are, they are political; they are not economical. That is number one.

Number two is if you look at who these guys are and where they're headed, there is something worse than death. I, for one, don't plan on being a happy citizen in a totalitarian state. There is a tremendous advantage – to me – of understanding what's going on and why because then the lies don't drive me crazy and I can live my own life. I can live free. THE SOLARI REPORT



You're very free. Your mind is free. I think there is only one way to navigate this thing, and that is to look it square in the face and deal with the uncertainty and laugh about it. Do you know what I mean? We don't have to go along.

RICHARD DOLAN: We completely agree. I agree 100% with you. I don't necessarily think that what I'm doing in my life is going to transform the world other than transform a number of people who may be listening and get into the research as with you, but I do it because what is the alternative? I have to be free. I have to be free in my mind, and I want to be able to pursue my research. The alternative is what? Watching Monday night football or Dancing with the Stars?

In my DNA I'm not able to do that, so I have to do what I'm doing. I believe in what I do just as you do. I have to think that if enough of us get together and we work and we put our heads together and collaborate that we can contribute to making the world a better place. I have to believe that, and I do believe that.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: I don't think this is a fait accompli at all because I've lived inside of empire, and what I have to tell you is – well, you know the story about when they asked me to join the Council on Foreign Relations. It was a wonderful guy who asked me. He pushed this glossy brochure towards me. When I said, "I just can't," he looked terrified.

He said, "You don't understand. You'll be out forever."

Just at that moment I had a flash of them taking my name off of my underground locker. I thought, "I'd rather die on the surface with the hoi polloi."

RICHARD DOLAN: "You don't understand. You'll be out forever."

C. AUSTIN FITTS: "You'll be out forever." Literally what I saw in my mind was my name coming off of my underground locker, but here was the thing. The thought of getting stuck underground with all of those folks was more horrifying to me than whatever was going to face me in the



wilderness.

RICHARD DOLAN: So he was giving you a threat like, "You'll be out forever."

C. AUSTIN FITTS: No, this was a wonderful man who I liked and admired very much. He was afraid for me because he understood that if I was out what that meant.

That I know of I didn't have an underground locker.

RICHARD DOLAN: Like when it fits the fan.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: If you're one of the members of the council and you're in certain groups, when the whatever hits the fan you'll be taken care of. That was always the 'wink, wink' assumption. He was sincerely terrified for me.

RICHARD DOLAN: And then you went through your 'enemy of the state' saga.

C. AUSTIN FITTS: You know it's really funny because all my life what I wanted to do was get out, and I didn't understand that the only way out was to get thrown out.

Anyway, in closing let's talk about how people can get more information. First I want to really recommend your new book, *UFOs for the 21st Century Mind* which I refer to as the definitive introduction and overview of the whole topic. Then there's Richard's book *Hidden in Plain Sight* which you published.

You also have a lecture on underground facilities that is up on YouTube that people can watch. I'm hoping I can persuade you to give us the pictures so that we can use it on the video so they can see the pictures.

And then there are books that I've done by very respected, sober researchers who have had genuine contributions to make in the field.
